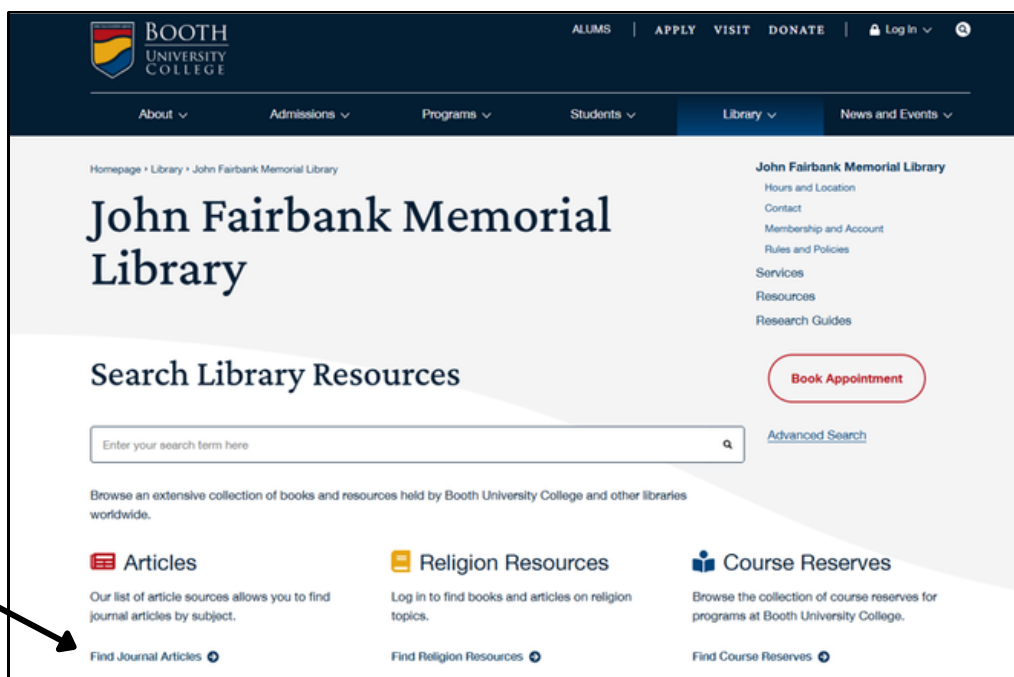

Searching

From the Advanced Search, type “Harvard Business Review” in quotes in the first field input and select “Source” from the dropdown menu to the right of the field.

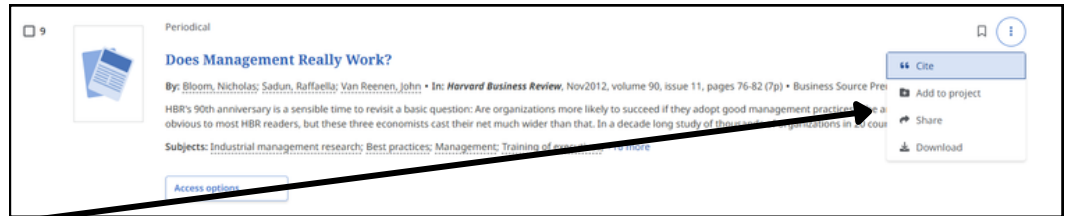
Access options

From the results page, click the three dots beside the entry and then click Share.

From the article record, click the Share icon



From both, a new window will appear. Click Create link. Copy and paste the link to your desired location.

If desired, add the prefix text `http://ezproxy.boot huc.ca/login?url=` onto the beginning of the link to ensure you have to login to Booth UC's proxy to access the article.
