Shelter U **Breaking Barriers to Education.**

At Booth University College in Winnipeg, 'Education for a Better World' just got more practical.

In Fall 2024, Booth UC launched **Shelter U**, a pilot program offering free university-level education to individuals facing economic precariousness, housing insecurity, and forced displacement, including those experiencing homelessness.

Shelter U **Built for Accessibility.**

- Students are referred from community agencies across Winnipeg's inner city
- Classes are co-hosted at The Salvation Army Centre of Hope
- Tuition is free, and all students receive laptops and course materials
- Students attend alongside Booth UC students for a shared classroom experience
- Shelter staff participate in learning activities and provide support outside class

Funding is shared by Booth UC, The Salvation Army Centre of Hope, and local private donors.

Graduates of the program receive:

- A certificate of completion
- A letter of reference and support
- Automatic readmission into future Shelter U courses.

A Vision for Transformation

"Shelter U aims to overcome barriers to education having to do with economic precariousness and forced displacement," says Aaron Klassen, pilot director and Assistant Professor of Sociology at Booth UC and Program Director of Community and Urban Transformation Studies (CUT).

He continues,

"For students in the CUT program, and for other Booth UC students seeking practicum credit, it will offer the opportunity to gain practical experience with an inner-city-based agency working with the vulnerable, while also connecting that experience to wider urban communities and policies affecting refugees and people experiencing homelessness."

Klassen goes on to explain:

"And as an innovative research program for Booth UC, it also represents some of the exciting collaborative work we do."

Dr. Stephen D. Borys, PhD, OM, DLitt
President, Civic Muse, Inc.
Former Director & CEO,
Winnipeg Art Gallery – Qaumajuq



Dr. Stephen Borys is President of Civic Muse, Inc., a consulting initiative dedicated to advancing the power of arts and culture in community transformation. He recently concluded a 17-year tenure as Director & CEO of the Winnipeg Art Gallery, where he led the creation of Qaumajuq—the world's first Inuit Art Centre.

He and his team drew more than \$135 million in donated money, artwork, and sponsorships in less than two decades, fueling one of the most significant cultural renewals in the country.

A respected museum and community leader, Dr. Borys believes the arts and humanities can guide us toward more resilient, just, and healthy communities. He is a member of the Order of Manitoba and holds a PhD in Art and Architectural History, along with honorary and professional distinctions including DLitt.
